Potassium Iodide Distribution Clinic Outcomes:

Thank you to Dr. Dorson Mills and Christine Azzante for helping the health department with the Salem clinic. While it was a very hot day, operations went smoothly for the first drive through clinic for Salem County for any purpose. Over 340 households were served over a three hour clinic with little to no wait time in line. The majority of households filled out registration forms ahead of the clinic by either picking up the form from a public distribution point or printing the form from the CS Health web site. The pre-registration option increased the efficiency of the operations. The drive through clinic design will be utilized for flu this fall in both Cumberland and Salem in addition to walk in clinics since both departments have had success with the design. Last fall, Cumberland had a large drive through flu clinic in Millville. Judy Diaz-Roberts and Carolyn Howell of the CSMRC assisted with the clinic along with 20 nursing students from Cumberland County College. After their experience, several of the nursing students joined the CSMRC as new citizen volunteers.
